St Peter's Church in Wales Primary School Pupil Premium Grant report to parents 2023-24

Overview

The Pupil Premium (Deprivation) Grant was introduced in April 2012 for pupils in Wales from low-income families. It is a sum of money allocated to schools to close the attainment gap between those eligible for free school meals and their wealthier peers. Disadvantaged pupils are pupils that have been recorded as eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years or pupils in care who have been continuously looked after for more than six months by the local authority.

- The premium is available for children eligible for free school meals and pupils in care
- Schools are free to spend the extra funding as they see fit but from September 2012, the government requires schools to publish information about how they use it

Using the Funding:

For the year April 2023 to March 2024 the pupil premium funding is allocated in the following way:

- Maintain hours for ALNST (additional learning needs support teacher) for use within both
 Foundation Phase and KS2 to support targeted pupils across the curriculum
- Support with costs for educational visits

Children from disadvantaged backgrounds will have opportunities for quality individual attention and experience of up to date equipment and resources such as ipads which they might not have access to at home.

Accountability

The head teacher and leadership team will regularly monitor, evaluate and review the strategies we have put in place for PDG and report to the Governing Body on its progress and impact.

Measuring the impact of PDG spending

Our school data, which is published on our school prospectus available on our website www.stpeters-pri.wrexham.sch.uk shows that we are a high performing school. We believe that every experience children have, has contributed towards their achievements, including those funded by this grant.

We will continue to use this grant to enrich children's experiences to help them become increasingly confident and independent in all aspects of their learning.
