This term our topic is... Discoveries.

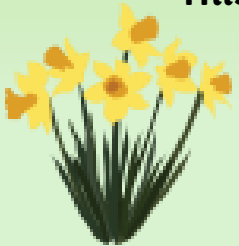
As part of our whole-school topic “Discoveries”, pupils in Dosbarth Caernarfon will be learning about discoveries, with a focus on Antarctica and the famous race to the South Pole. Children will find out about early explorers, including Scott of the Antarctic, and learn what life was like for people exploring one of the coldest and most challenging places on Earth.

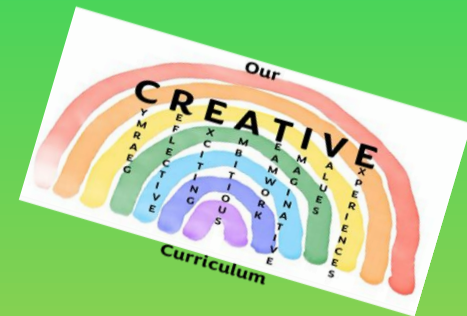
Pupils will explore how explorers lived, travelled, and stayed safe in extreme conditions. They will look at the clothing and equipment used in the past and compare it with what explorers use today.

Through stories, pictures, discussions, and practical activities, children will build an understanding of life in the past and how exploration has changed over time.

Throughout the topic, pupils will develop important skills such as asking questions, sharing ideas, working with others, and using simple digital tools to support their learning.

This topic supports children’s learning at the end of Progression Step 2 within the Curriculum for Wales and encourages curiosity, creativity, and confidence across the curriculum.
