

Our CREATIVE Curriculum in the Summer Term (Bl. 3)

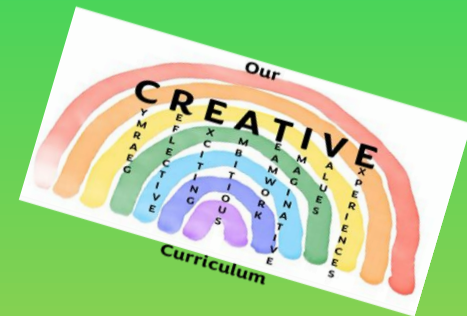
This term our topic is... **Look out, Look out.**

As part of our whole-school topic “Look Out, Look Out”, pupils in Dosbarth Caernarfon will be exploring the important environmental issue of deforestation and the impact it has on our world. Through this topic, children will begin to understand what deforestation is, why it happens, and how it affects forests, wildlife, and the planet. They will also explore the reasons why people sometimes cut down forests and consider the different viewpoints surrounding this complex issue. As their knowledge grows, pupils will be encouraged to think carefully and develop their own opinions about whether the benefits of deforestation outweigh the disadvantages.

Throughout the topic, children will also develop a range of important skills. They will practise working collaboratively with others, communicating their thoughts and ideas, and asking meaningful questions to deepen their understanding. Pupils will also begin to use simple digital tools to research information, present their ideas, and support their learning in creative ways.

This topic supports children’s learning at the end of Progression Step 2 within the Curriculum for Wales. It aims to nurture curiosity about the world around them while building confidence, creativity, and independence across the curriculum. By the end of the topic, pupils will have developed not only a greater awareness of environmental issues but also the skills to think critically, work together, and express their own ideas with confidence.
